Conditions:

- a) If successful in your application, you will be required to join the Society either as a Life or Annual Member at the current rate of subscription (Life £50, Annual £10).

- b) Unless there are good reasons otherwise, it is expected that you will use the Church of Scotland's St Andrew's Guesthouse in Jerusalem as your base with the first week of your accommodation being paid for by the Society of Friends on a Bed & Breakfast basis. It is recognised that your studies may require you to stay longer at the Guesthouse or, from time to time, stay elsewhere the cost of which will be your responsibility.

- c) You should contact the Minister of St Andrew's Jerusalem once the scholarship has been awarded, in order to start planning your visit.

- d) You will be required to attend Sunday services in St Andrew's and become involved in the life of the church/guesthouse; staff will offer guidance as to how to achieve this.

- e) You will be expected to carry out the aim of your scholarship conscientiously and to submit a written report to the Society on your return to the UK. (This may be the same report as may be required by your university.)

- f) You should be prepared to attend the Society's AGM on the years before and after your visit along with the AGM in March of the Glasgow Society of the Sons and Daughters of Ministers of the Church of Scotland
